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| Name of Unit | Emergency Department (ED)- 2 nd Floor, Main Hospital |
| Patient Population | Patient population includes patients ranging from minor illnesses and injuries to critical medical and trauma patients to neonates to elderly. Care is also provided to psychiatric/behavioral health patients. |
| Number of beds | 34 Beds plus 4 Behavioral Health beds |
| Nurse/Patient Ratio | Varies based on acuity |
| Additional Info/Highlights | The ED sees over 65,000 patients per year. Certified Stroke Center and Chest Pain Accredited. Serves as the community hospital for High Point/Guilford |

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| Name of Unit | Inpatient Behavioral Health – 5 th floor, Cancer Center Building | |
| Patient Population | East Hall patient population serves patients with chronic mental illness such as schizophrenia and psychosis. West Hall patient population serves patients with substance abuse, major depressive disorder, anxiety with suicidal or homicidal thoughts. | |
| Number of beds | 28 Beds | |
| Nurse/Patient Ratio | 1:6-7 (Days), 1:7-9 (Nights) | |
| Additional Info/Highlights | Daily staff includes a psychiatrist, physician assistant, nurse practitioner, staff nurses and nurse techs, therapists, and a utilization review clinician. This is a short-term acute care locked unit. The average length of stay for patients is 3 to 5 days. | |

| Patient Population | Patient populations ranging in age from 5 years up. Pediatric surgical patients are not common. Adolescent to older adult is the largest population. |

| Nurse/Patient Ratio | 1:1 (per OR room) |
| Additional Info/Highlights | HPRH offers the following services in OR: Neurosurgery, Orthopedic, Ortho- Spine, General, Urology, GYN, Cardiovascular and Bariatric. Robotics used in GYN, General and Urology. Approximately 6,500 cases per year. Four new OR rooms built in 2017, new CVOR to be completed by 2018 with renovation of five OR'S to be completed by 2019. |

| Name of Unit | Post-Anesthesia Care Unit (PACU)- 3 rd Floor, Main Hospital |
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| Patient Population | Age 5 and up. Largest population adolescent to older adult. |
| Number of beds | 10 bays with one isolation room. |
| Nurse/Patient Ratio | 1:2 unless policy states otherwise. |
| Additional Info/Highlights | ACLS required. All surgical patients except CABG/Valve go to PACU. Other patient populations served are patients from cardiac cath lab, vascular lab and EP lab as well as Endoscopy and on occasion interventional radiology. |

| Name of Unit | Day Hospital- 3 rd Floor, Main Hospital |
|-------------------------------|---|
| Patient Population | Pediatric to older adult. This department serves as the prep for procedure area of the hospital. |

| Nurse/Patient Ratio | 1:3 |
| Additional Info/Highlights | Pre admissions (a division of DH) sees on average 600 patients per month. Day Hospital preps patients going for procedures in the following locations, OR, Vascular lab, Interventional Radiology and Endoscopy. Day Hospital preps on average 40 patients/day. Day Hospital is the Phase II area for discharge of outpatients as well. Total volume for this department is approximately 10,000 /year. |

| Critical Care Medicine | |

| Name of Unit | Intensive Care Unit – 4 South (ICU) |
| Patient Population | General medical/surgical ICU designed to provide care for a wide variety of diagnoses in patients who are critically ill requiring immediate treatment and continuous monitoring of cardiac, respiratory, hemodynamic, and neurologic status, and intensive nursing care by RNs and unlicensed support staff. |
| Number of beds | 20 Beds |
| Nurse/Patient Ratio | 1:1 or 1:2 for Critical Care Patients (1:3 or 1:4 for Overflow patients) |
| Additional Info/Highlights | Utilizes telemedicine service for night shift coverage. All nurses are required to be ACLS and NIHSS Certified. The PALS and CCRN Certification is highly encouraged. |

| Name of Unit | Coronary Care Unit – 4 Northeast (CCU) |
|-------------------------------|---|
| Patient Population | Patient population in this cardiac intensive care unit often includes those admitted with a STEMI, pre- and post-CABG, hypothermia protocol, sepsis, cardiogenic shock, as well as medical ICU overflow patients. |
| Number of beds | 8 Beds |
| Nurse/Patient Ratio | 1:1 or 1:2 for Critical Care Patients (1:4 for Overflow patients) |
| Additional Info/Highlights | Highly skilled, specialty area often utilizing critical specialty medications such as Amiodarone, Levophed, Neo-synephrine, Integrillin, Nimbex, Propofol, and Vasopressin. Specialty equipment and critical care knowledge of IABP, Impella, Artic Sun, temporary pacemakers, Ultrafiltration, and Femstop devices as well as ventilators, chest tubes, Swan Ganz, and transcutaneous and epicardial pacing. |

| Patient Population | Private room unit providing care for the postpartum patients utilizing the couplet care model, with an emphasis on Patient and Family Centered Care. Infant Rooming-In provided. Additional patient population consists of antepartum patients, clean gynecology and other Med-Surg patients. |

| Name of Unit | Cardiac Telemetry Unit – 4 North (CTU) |
| Patient Population | Patient population comprised mostly of those with cardiac-related symptoms and post-cardiac intervention procedures including those with chest pain, CHF, as well as sepsis. Post cardiac intervention procedures include ablations, pacemakers, stents, and open heart surgery. |
| Number of beds | 18 Beds |
| Nurse/Patient Ratio | 1:3 or 1:4 |
| Additional Info/Highlights | Frequently used specialty medications and infusions include Amiodarone, Cardizem, Lasix, Dobutamine, Dopamine, and Tridil. Specialty equipment used and competency checkoffs include pacemakers, sheath removal (TR band, femoral sheath), care of the patient with an MI, and post-open heart surgery and cardiac interventions. |

| Additional Info/Highlights | The Medical Telemetry Unit (MTU) is a 36-bed intermediate level unit serving patients with various and multiple medical diagnoses that require continuous cardiac monitoring. The targeted nurse to patient ratio is 1:4. Our ancillary staff, which includes both nursing assistants and secretaries, also serves a vital role in providing remarkable patient care. MTU prides itself on teamwork, opportunities for personal and professional growth, and a welcoming work environment. MTU practices shared governance and encourages its' employees to be actively involved both within the unit and among the organization. |

| Patient Population | General population includes medical and surgical patients. This unit specializes in the care of various orthopedic complaints, post-operative urology care, post-operative bariatric care. |

| Additional Info/Highlights | Unit is equipped to care for remote telemetry patients. We frequently apply bucks traction, overhead trapeze, and both continuous and manual bladder irrigation. |

| Patient Population | Chronic disease population (COPD, DM, CHF, CRF). This unit receives patient getting peritoneal dialysis. Our oncology patient population includes those requiring inpatient chemotherapy, oncology symptom management, mastectomy and robotic g/u postsurgical patients, and end-of-life care. |
